

Call for elections
**The General Election for the Vice-President representing Political Science
Students
Autumn 2026**

Pursuant to Section 42 of the Statutes of the Students' Union of The Faculty of Law, (hereinafter: ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes) which is a part of the Statutes of the Students' Union of Eötvös Lóránd University, the Chair of the Supervisory Board calls for the general election of the Vice-President representing Political Science Students of the Students' Union.

Deadlines and periods

Nomination Period: 7-20 October 2026
Announcement of the nomination results: 22 October 2026
Campaign period: 2-15 November 2026
Election period: 16-29 November 2026
Results of the election: 29 November 2026
Entry into force of the election results: 2 December 2026

Voting rights

Pursuant to ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes

Section 18

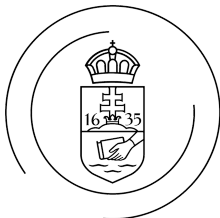
- (1) The exercise of voting rights is based on the student's free will
- (2) Students included in the electoral register may exercise their voting rights in the election
- (3) Any member of the Students' Union with an active student status who can be assigned under the Statutes to the relevant electoral district is entitled to be included in the electoral register

Section 19

- (1) The students of the faculty elect the following by universal and equal suffrage, by secret and direct ballot:
 - b) the President of the Students' Union
- (2) In an electoral district, a student may cast the same number of votes as the number of Delegates' Assembly representatives or officers who may be elected under the Statutes. This number may not exceed the number of valid nominations submitted in the electoral district.

Nomination

Nomination period: 7–20 October 2026



Place of nomination: Students' Union Office, 1053 Budapest, 10–12 Kecskeméti Street. The stamped nomination forms and the declaration for presidential candidates may be collected at this address. A nomination is valid only if these documents are used.

The procedure of nomination

Pursuant to ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes

Section 39

- (1) The Vice-President representing Political Science Students is elected from among the students enrolled in the Political Science BA and Political Science MA programmes.
(2) The Vice-President representing Political Science Students may be re-elected once.

Section 40

(1) The validity of a nomination for the position of Vice-President representing Political Science Students is subject to the following conditions:

- a) a declaration supporting the candidate, authenticated by the handwritten signatures of 50 students containing their names and Neptun codes whom belong to the relevant electoral district ;
- b) a declaration by the candidate stating that:
 - ba) they accept the nomination;
 - bb) they do not hold any office incompatible with a representative mandate, or, if elected, they will resign from such office;
 - bc) their nomination does not conflict with Section 60 (2a), point a) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education;
- c) proof of the candidate's student status by means of official documentation;
- d) submission of a vice-presidential programme from the candidate.

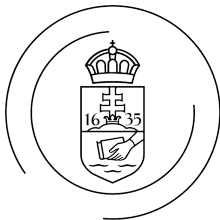
The nomination forms may be collected and submitted at the Students' Union Office on working days between 12:00 and 16:00 during the nomination period. Candidates must verify their identity with proper identification documentation.

Voting

Pursuant to Section 39 (1) of ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes, the students enrolled in the Faculty's Political Science BA and Political Science MA programmes shall elect the Vice-President of the Students' Union representing Political Science Students by universal and equal suffrage, by secret and direct ballot, through the Neptun online platform.

Voting period: 16–29 November 2026

The purpose of the election is for the eligible members of the Students' Union to elect the new Vice-President representing Political Science Students from among themselves.



Rules of the electoral procedure

The election of ELTE Faculty of Law Students' Union Vice-President representing Political Science Students shall be conducted in accordance with Sections 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 39, 40 and 41 of the ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes.

The ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes also comply with all requirements concerning electoral procedures set out in higher-ranking sources of law. The rules governing the procedure are set out in full in the ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes, which are available on the official ELTE Students' Union website containing the organisation's regulations.

- The Chair of the Supervisory Board calls the election for the Vice-President of the Students' Union representing Political Science Students.
- Following the publication of the call for elections, the Supervisory Board compiles the electoral register.
- During the nomination period, voters nominate candidates in the manner described above.
- Once the nomination period has ended, the Supervisory Board determines the identities of the candidates for Vice-President representing Political Science Students.
- During the election, voters cast their vote for one of the candidates for Vice-President representing Political Science Students. The candidate who receives the most votes wins the election.
- Following the election, the Supervisory Board determines the result by means of a resolution. The result enters into force three days after the closing of the election, at which point the elected Vice-President representing Political Science Students obtains their mandate.

The right to appeal

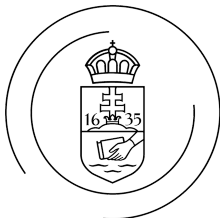
Pursuant to ELTE ÁJK Students' Union Statutes

Section 24

(4) The result of the nominations is determined by a resolution of the Supervisory Board. An objection may be lodged against the resolution. An objection has suspensive effect.

Section 25

(7) If the Supervisory Board fails to include a voter in the electoral register, the voter may request their inclusion from the Supervisory Board within three days of receiving the



information specified in paragraph (6). The Supervisory Board shall decide on the request without delay, but no later than within one day.

(8) A voter may appeal to the Supervisory Board against the decision referred to in paragraph (7) within two days.

(9) After the period available for the procedure under paragraph (8) has expired, the Supervisory Board shall establish the final electoral register.

Section 28

(1) The result of the election is determined by a resolution of the Supervisory Board. An objection may be lodged against the resolution. An objection has suspensive effect.
